Oklahoma Single Parent Scholarship Program (OSPSP) is a private, nonprofit organization founded in 2016 on the principle of providing scholarship funding and support services to high potential, low-income single parents. With a bit of financial support and encouragement, eligible single parents - many of them working full-time, raising children alone, struggling to make ends meet and on the brink of dropping out of college - can earn life-changing degrees and escape poverty. Scholarships are offered twice a year for the Fall and Spring semesters. Potential recipients must complete an application demonstrating their need for assistance, potential for success, and proof of full-time enrollment. After the student is awarded, they are matched with a mentor to set goals and receive support.

President's Perspective Lisa Edmonds, Board President

Fall weather is upon us and the wheels are always in motion at Oklahoma Single Parent Scholarship Program. More people in the community are learning about our amazing organization where we serve motivated, low income single parents who achieve their goal of earning a college degree and becoming financially independent. The demand is high and the need to serve our students continues to grow at a rapid pace. Our unrestricted scholarship of \$1200 per semester makes a huge difference for single parents navigating school, children and basic needs.

OSPSP has seen tremendous growth since it was established in 2016, growing from 5 scholarships granted to 50. I joined the board in 2019 and it was my first time to be involved in a relatively new organization, at the time what I would consider a grassroots non-profit. Board members were involved in every aspect, including the administrative tasks of running OSPSP. Most of the members had their own careers and this was a side commitment that generated passion. Part time administrative help was gradually added and thanks to our growth and generous donors we were able to hire a full time program director this spring. Julie Leclercq was introduced in our last newsletter and she took off running before we could say GO!

We closed September with our Reach for the Stars fundraiser, held at the ever generous venue of Dunlap Codding in downtown OKC. What a great evening and we raised \$64,000! YOU made that happen and we are truly grateful.

Enjoy this edition of our newsletter where you'll learn more about our mentorship program, our newly established endowment at Oklahoma City Communities Foundation and newest board members.

Please share the good news of Oklahoma Single Parent Scholarship Program and know your financial contribution truly does make a difference with us. We are small, but we think BIG!

MENTOR PERSPECTIVE

I served as a mentor the last two years to a dedicated single mom student who graduated this past Spring with her B.S. degree and is currently continuing her Master's Degree studies in Diet and Nutrition Sciences at UCO. She greatly appreciated OSPSP's financial and emotional support.



My current student, Lori R. is working diligently to receive her RN degree from Rose State. She is an older Mom, returning to school to ensure financially security. She has one grown daughter with a 7 year old living on their own. In her home, Lori has a 16 year old daughter, as well as her 18 year old daughter (studying to get her GED), and her 16 month old grandchild. Lori's academic goal is to graduate in May 2024 after she completes the required clinical rotations, and then to find a secure job as a registered nurse.

Lori described the daily pressure she feels as a single parent student, "I was really worried about financial aid last semester. It's been a struggle to pay rent and the OSPSP scholarship helped me cover it. I also like the support safety net that the mentors provide as listeners and resources for us".

As a mentor, my role is to be a good listener and encourager. Our students are already on a tight timeframe, so we often just text or call to stay in touch. Lori lets me know when she finishes a big exam week, and updates me on upcoming challenges and goals. During finals week, OSPSP provides care packages to all of our recipients. Hopefully it is reassuring that others are in their corner, cheering for their success. - Marcy Price, OSPSP Mentor

Chris joined the OSPSP board earlier this year and has added his voice and support to our work on behalf of single parents as both a board member and mentor to a male student. He heard about OSPSP through contacts in his workplace at Bank of Oklahoma. Before Chris attended college and met his wife, he served in the Air Force for seven years and was deployed overseas multiple times. "I feel like I am here for a purpose because so many didn't come home or were maimed." Now that Chris is happily married and has a young child of his own, he recognizes the many stresses and challenges of today's students to complete their degrees. "I never had a grandfather and my own parents grew up in single parent homes and were young parents themselves. ... I am happy to do my part to help others now that I am in a position to do so."

LuAnne Kuelzer, Ph.D. is an associate professor of English at OSU-OKC. Enrolling in college as a newly divorced mother of three, LuAnne experienced many of the hardships and barriers to success that OSPSP students face. In the fourteen years between marriages, LuAnne earned three university degrees, while also working full time. She has been an OSPSP mentor for three years.

LuAnne is perfectly situated to encourage and to empathize with her mentees to put one foot in front of the other to meet their academic goals despite all the challenges and stresses of being a single parent.

"I have complete empathy for single parents trying to complete their degrees, because I went back to school as a single parent with minimal financial support."

LuAnne is now in a position to provide a sense of hope to first generation college students to "just keep putting one foot in front of the other" until they reach their academic and professional goals.

OSPSP Commits to Organization Longevity with Endowment

Oklahoma Single Parent Scholarship Program created an endowment with the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in 2023 with an initial gift of \$35,000 from one charitable donor. The generous support of the Kirkpatrick Family Foundation and several other donors in 2023 allowed the new endowment to grow to about \$53,000. The endowment began for the purpose of ensuring the long-term sustainability and growth of OSPSP. Our goal for the endowment remains the same as it was at the inception of the endowment: Funds generated will be used to strengthen the organization's capacity to help low-income single parents increase their education levels and improve their ability to care for their families. We will use endowment-generated funds as a reliable source

for future operational support. While donations to OSPSP is necessary for our current day to day operations and scholarship opportunities, donations to the endowment are just as important for our longevity.
